I would like to thank all the dedicated hard working volunteers that made the opening of school such a smooth transition. A special thanks to the PTA Board for the hard work they put in every day.

Student attendance and behavior are of vital importance to our students' academic success. Students in Pre-K through 1st Grade should be in their designated locations at 8:10 am for the first bell. The tardy bell for these students rings at 8:20 a.m. Students in 2nd through 5th Grade should arrive in school by 8:25 a.m. for the first bell. The tardy bell for these students rings at 8:35 a.m. Please support us in our efforts. Also, take the time to review the Christina M. Eve Student Handbook that can be found on our web site.

The safety of our students is a top priority at Christina M. Eve Elementary School. In order to ensure student safety we need your cooperation with the arrival/dismissal procedures at our school. We dismiss approximately 600 students in about 10-12 minutes (800 on Wednesdays). The school was built with two drive-thru lanes for drop-off and pick-up. Parents may not park in the drive-thru lanes during arrival (7:45-8:40) and/or dismissal (1:30-3:30). We ask parents to be patient. Thank you in advance for your support in our efforts to ensure your child's safety.
