## A Message from Mrs. Gonzalez...

The safety of our students is a top priority at Christina M. Eve Elementary School. In order to ensure student safety we need your cooperation with the arrival/dismissal procedures at our school. We dismiss approximately 500 students in our main campus in about 10-12 minutes (600 on Wednesdays). The school was built with two drive-thru lanes for drop-off and pick-up. Parents may not park in the teachers parking lot or the drive-thru lanes during arrival (7:45-8:40) and/or dismissal (1:30-3:30). We ask parents to be patient. Our PLC was also built with a drive thru lane. We ask that you follow the same rules at the PLC as in our main campus. Thank you in advance for your support in our efforts to ensure your child's safety.

Student attendance and behavior are of vital importance to our students' academic success. Students in Pre-K through 1st Grade should be in their designated locations at 8:10 am for the first bell. The tardy bell for these students rings at 8:20 a.m. Students in 2nd through 5th Grade should arrive in school by 8:25 a.m. for the first bell. The tardy bell for these students rings at 8:35 a.m. Please support us in our efforts. Also, take the time to review the Christina M. Eve Student Handbook that can be found on our web site.

Christina M. Eve Elementary is a mandatory uniform school. Students are expected to wear their uniforms daily unless there is a special activity which permits them to dress differently. The uniform must include the school logo.
